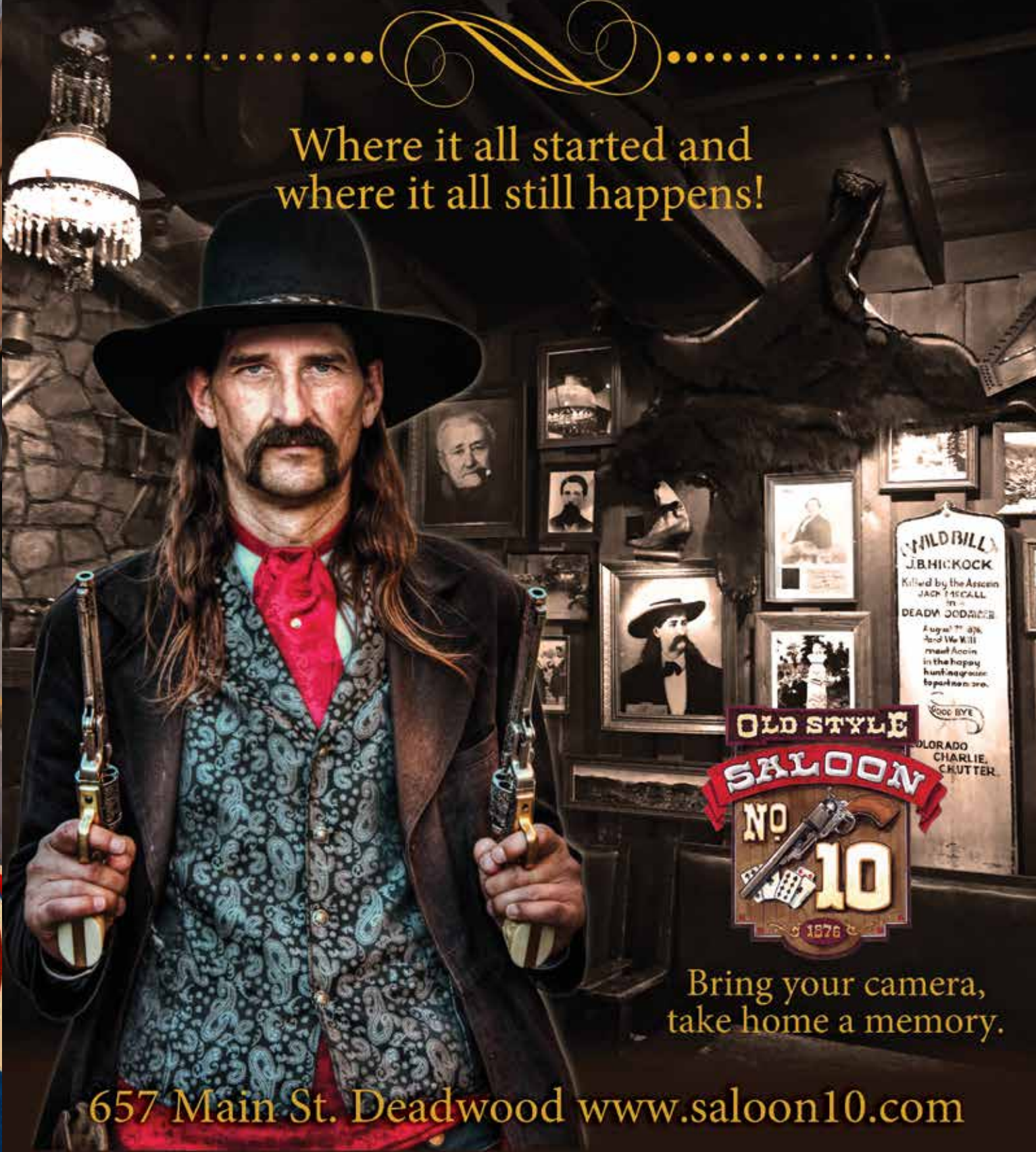

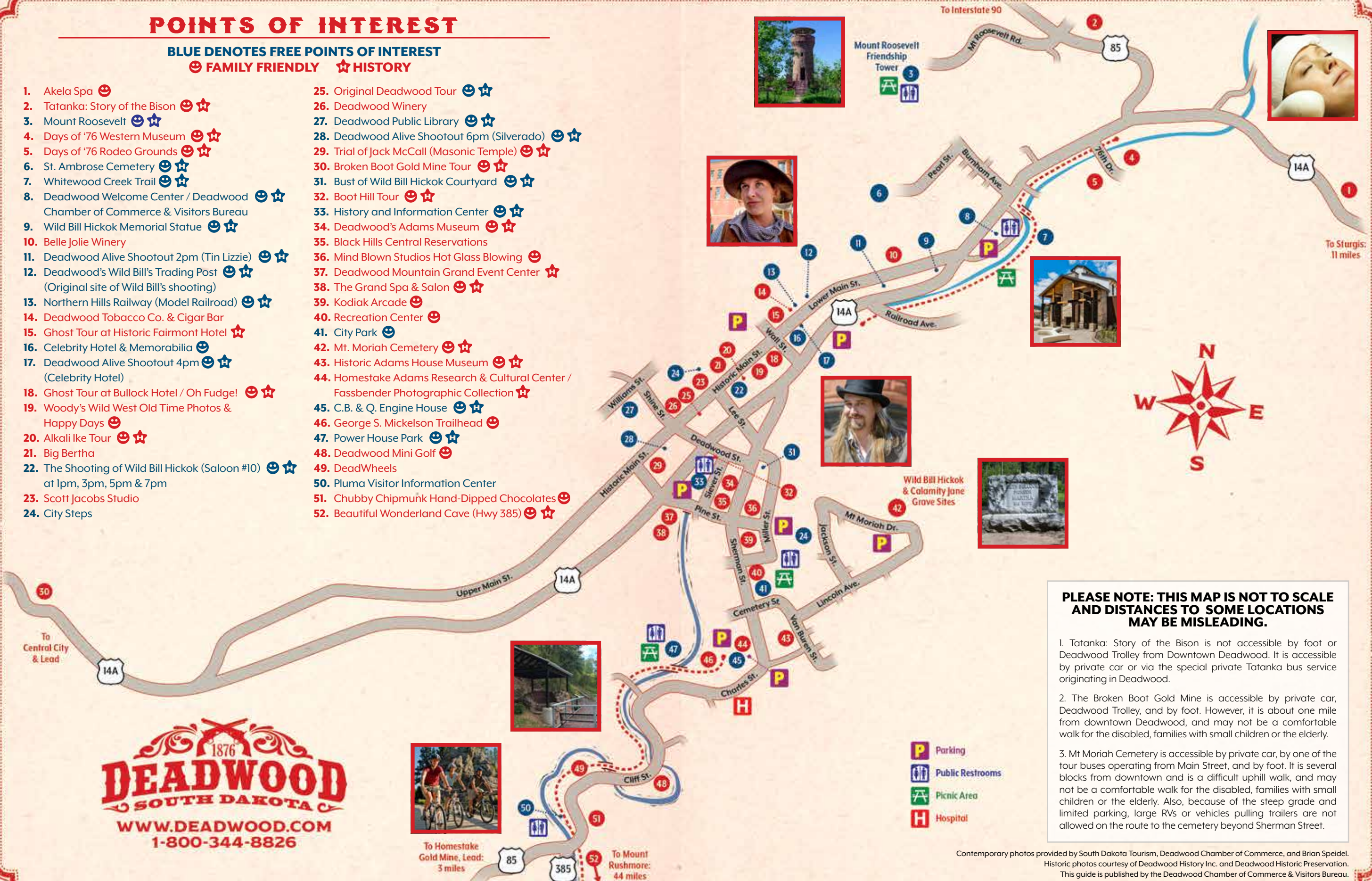

1. Tatanka: Story of the Bison is not accessible by foot or Deadwood Trolley from Downtown Deadwood. It is accessible by private car or via the special private Tatanka bus service originating in Deadwood.
2. The Broken Boot Gold Mine is accessible by private car, Deadwood Trolley, and by foot. However, it is about one mile from downtown Deadwood, and may not be a comfortable walk for the disabled, families with small children or the elderly.
3. Mt Moriah Cemetery is accessible by private car, by one of the tour buses operating from Main Street, and by foot. It is several blocks from downtown and is a difficult uphill walk, and may not be a comfortable walk for the disabled, families with small children or the elderly. Also, because of the steep grade and limited parking, large RVs or vehicles pulling trailers are not allowed on the route to the cemetery beyond Sherman Street.

WELCOME

TO DEADWOOD

Make a Deadwood information location your first stop when you get to town. The new Deadwood Welcome Center (501 Main Street) features free parking, an indoor trolley waiting area, creek access and loads of great information to help plan your stay and activities. Additional information locations include the History and Information Center (historic train depot at 3 Siever Street) and the Information Wagon (seasonal, a historic chuckwagon that travels to various locations on Main Street).

Once you've parked your car and have a plan, hop on a Deadwood Trolley. Rides only cost \$1 per person, per ride and the trolleys' loop routes mean you'll rarely walk more than three blocks before reaching a boarding location. Trolleys run from morning into the night, picking up at each location every 20-30 minutes. Be sure to pick up a current schedule at a Deadwood information location. Trolley operating hours and frequency change with the seasons.

GET LUCKY

IN DEADWOOD



In 1876, thousands of prospectors descended upon Deadwood Gulch. The promise of gold and a better life inspired a flood of fortune-seekers into the canyons and peaks of the Lakota's sacred Black Hills.



Though many gold rush towns died almost as soon as they started, Deadwood was different. The nearby mines went through booms and busts, but the gold kept coming. Generations of miners toiled underground, and when their shifts were over, they came to Deadwood saloons, brothels and gambling halls to unwind and relax. It didn't matter that this was all mostly illegal; Deadwood had always been a town on the edge of the law, and the people who came for a good time didn't mind bending a rule or two.

Things changed in 1989. After more than a century of gambling on the down-low, Deadwood became the third place in the United States (after Atlantic City and the state of Nevada) to allow legal gaming. The card tables and slot machines

came out from the back rooms, and the town boomed. Fueled by the new tax revenue, the town began an ambitious historic preservation effort that continues today. Gaming expanded again in 2015, when roulette, craps and keno joined the town's existing poker tables, blackjack games and slot machines.

Not sure where to start? Here's a quick primer on the kinds of games you'll find in Deadwood.



SLOT MACHINES

Slot machines are the most common casino game in Deadwood, but the games are as diverse as they are universal. Penny slots are the crowd favorite, with a multitude of betting options that makes the game fun and low-cost. Progressive systems link the same machines throughout town creating an ever-growing jackpot amount. And many machines have the flexibility of being multi-denomination, so your desired bet changes with the click of a button.

POKER

A good poker game in Deadwood is always available, but you'll have to search a little longer than you do for slots. A handful of casinos offer live poker games, and the play at them is outstanding. The most popular flavors are Texas Hold 'em and Omaha, both community card games. Depending

on times, games start with blinds as low as \$2 and \$4. There's a variety of additional table games offered in Deadwood, such as Let It Ride, Caribbean Stud, Ultimate Texas Hold-em, 3-Card, 4-Card and more. If you're unfamiliar with the game, stop in a casino that offers poker during a slower time of day; most dealers will be happy to help you learn the basics. And remember, all you need is a chip and a chair.

BLACKJACK

Blackjack, also called 21, is a game that's easy to learn, making it the most popular casino game in the world. You'll find blackjack at most of the medium-size and larger gaming venues in Deadwood. While most games use multiple decks, if you ask around you'll find some single-deck tables, which give the house a significantly smaller advantage. Ask most any gaming



professional and they'll tell you blackjack offers the best odds in the house.

CRAPS

Like blackjack, craps is one of the most popular casino games in the world. You can walk through about any casino and if there's crowd gathered, you can almost bet it's around a craps table. Craps is played by one player, or a group of players betting

against the house. Though the board and action can look intimidating, the game is easy to learn and fun to play.

ROULETTE

Roulette is one of three games new to Deadwood in 2015. Roulette can be found at the town's larger gaming venues. Another easy game to learn, your roulette strategy can be kept simple by betting on red or black, on odds or evens, or up the potential winnings by selecting particular numbers. Then, just sit back and watch the wheel do the work.



KENO

Keno is another one of the new games. Think of it as part lottery, part bingo. Keno is a simple game to learn: grab a card, pick your numbers and watch the balls get picked. Simple as that.

HISTORY NUGGETS

WILD BILL HICKOK

Although Wild Bill Hickok is Deadwood's most famous resident, he was in town less than a month before he was shot down by Jack McCall on August 2, 1876.

The former gunfighter and lawman was famous long before Deadwood. He arrived by wagon train from Cheyenne in the company of Charlie Utter and Calamity Jane. Despite talk of prospecting for gold, Wild Bill didn't stray from the Badlands, a section of Main Street



known for its bars, brothels and gambling houses. He was playing poker in Nuttal & Mann's (Saloon No. 10) when Jack McCall walked in and shot Wild Bill in the back of the head. Bill was holding two pair, Aces and Eights, which became known as Dead Man's Hand.

Jack was first tried by a miner's court in Deadwood and found not guilty. He was later tried and executed in Yankton, the territorial capital, and buried with the noose still around his neck.

LEARN ABOUT THE OLD WEST

IN DEADWOOD



Deadwood was born in 1876, when a rush of gold miners and fortune seekers descended on the Northern Black Hills in the hopes of making a better life for themselves. The town was practically lawless in those early years, and the men and women who first came to Deadwood were people of fortitude and strength - folks who didn't mind a little struggle on the road to fame and fortune.



DEADWOOD HISTORY TIMELINE

1874 Col. George Armstrong Custer's expedition discovers gold on French Creek in the Southern Hills.



1875 A much richer gold deposit is discovered in Deadwood Gulch. The town of Custer is abandoned and miners stream north to stake claims.

1876 Deadwood becomes an official

town, although rough around the edges. Wild Bill Hickok is gunned down, and the Manuel brothers strike gold near present-day Lead.



1877 Mining mogul George Hearst buys the Manuel brothers' claim for \$70,000 and establishes the Homestake Mining Co. It would operate for 126 years and pull untold riches from beneath the Black Hills.

These folks were responsible for a number of lasting legends. The dime novel exploits of Wild Bill, Calamity Jane, Deadwood Dick and other heroes captivated turn-of-the-20th-century America. In many ways they still define modern Deadwood.

That means that when you visit Deadwood, you're diving head-first into living history. You don't have to pore over old records or listen to lectures to know what Deadwood was like 140 years ago -- though you can. Just walk the brick-paved streets, and you'll immerse yourself in continental America's last great gold rush.

That's why TrueWest Magazine named Deadwood its #1 True West Town for 2017, Best Place to Live Like a Cowboy (Summer)-Editor's Choice, Best Town for Historic Entertainment-Editor's Choice, and Best Architecturally Preserved Western Town-Reader's Choice.

Want to learn more? There are plenty of ways to put yourself in the middle of Deadwood's Wild West past.

DEADWOOD WALKING TOUR

Pick up a free brochure for this self-guided tour at one of Deadwood's two manned visitor centers, 501 Main Street and 3 Siever Street, or at City Hall, 108 Sherman Street. Also, interpretive signs at important locations will tell short stories from Deadwood's past. Scan the QR codes with your smartphone to see rare photographs and videos.

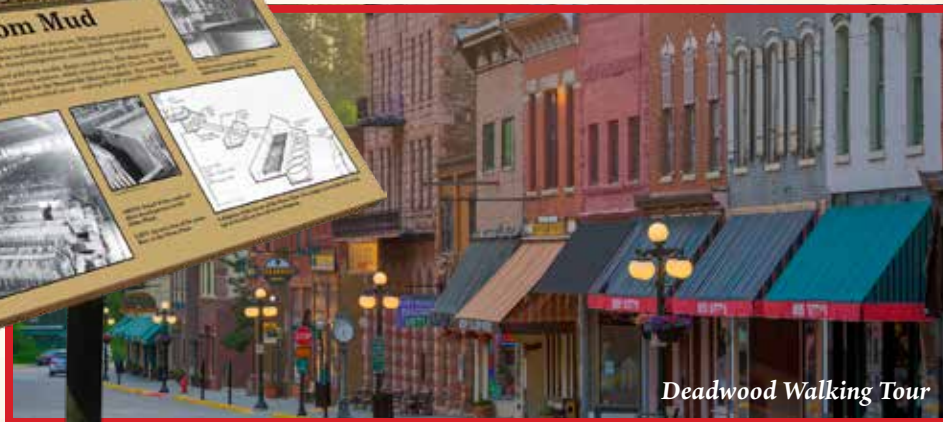
ADAMS MUSEUM

The oldest history museum in the Black Hills, the Adams Museum at 54 Sherman Street originally had a Victorian cabinet-of-curiosities philosophy: collect anything that looks cool and put it in a glass case. The museum still has an eclectic collection, including a one-of-a-kind plesiosaur fossil, Potato Creek Johnny's massive gold nugget, the mysterious Thoen

Stone and a mining locomotive. However, the recently renovated museum features modern displays that use artifacts to tell the important stories of Deadwood's past. Ask about special programs and temporary exhibits. Admission is a donation of \$5 for adults and \$2 for children. Open year-round.



Deadwood Walking Tour

1879 Fire rages through the city, destroying buildings and leaving 2,000 people homeless.

1890 The Fremont, Elkhorn & Missouri Valley Railroad begins passenger service to Deadwood.



1903 The Franklin Hotel opens; Calamity Jane dies.

1906 The Homestake Slime Plant (now the Deadwood Mountain Grand) is constructed.

1908 The Lawrence County Courthouse is completed.

1913 The Deadwood Auditorium (now the Deadwood Recreation Center) opens to the public.

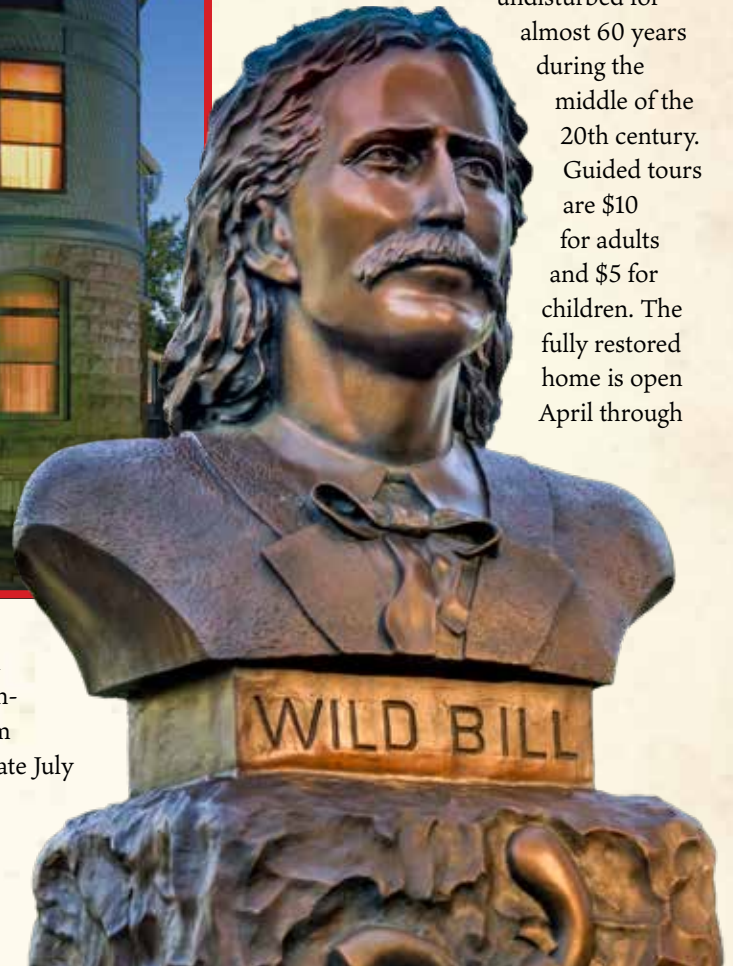

HISTORIC ADAMS HOUSE

Built in 1892, the Queen Anne home at 22 Van Buren Street was occupied by some of Deadwood's most influential merchant families. Its furnishings, hand-painted canvas wall coverings, stained glass windows and 19th-century plumbing sat undisturbed for almost 60 years during the middle of the 20th century. Guided tours are \$10 for adults and \$5 for children. The fully restored home is open April through



DAYS OF '76 MUSEUM

Located at 18 Seventy Six Drive, the newly built Days of '76 Museum has a large collection of horse-drawn wagons, coaches, carriages, 19th-century clothing, firearms, and Native American artifacts. The 32,000-square-foot building is a cool and quiet place to uncover some of Deadwood's earliest stories. Ask about

the special programs that sometimes happen in the event room downstairs or on the museum grounds, especially in late July during the Days of '76 celebration. Admission is \$8 for adults and \$3 for children. Open year-round.

DEADWOOD HISTORY TIMELINE

1924 Deadwood's first recognized Days of '76 celebration is held.



1929 Potato Creek Johnny reportedly finds a 7 3/4-ounce gold nugget, one of the largest ever found in the Black Hills. (At today's gold prices, it would be worth about \$9,300.)



1930 The Adams Memorial Hall Museum opens.

1938 The first Sturgis motorcycle rally is held in Sturgis.

1961 The entire town of Deadwood is declared a National Historic Landmark.

October. Ask about special events such as musical performances and history lectures during the summer on the lawn.

MOUNT MORIAH CEMETERY

Deadwood's first cemetery found plenty of involuntary occupants in 1876 and 1877, but the needs of the town's living residents soon prevailed over the deceased. The cemetery was moved to its present location at the top of Lincoln Avenue, and the old cemetery site was built over with houses. The well-traveled cemetery's lanes are broad and paved, but you can hike up to some of the wilder parts of the forested graveyard, including Seth Bullock's grave near the top of the mountain (about a 15-minute walk up a gravel forest service road). Be sure to stop at the graves of Calamity Jane and Wild Bill Hickok, the Chinese section and the paupers' sections. Admission is \$2 and includes a handy map of the cemetery at the entrance. You can pay a bit more for a guided bus tour during

the summer - just look for the kiosks downtown. The cemetery is open from dawn to dusk year-round.

OLD STYLE SALOON NO. 10 & THE TRIAL OF JACK MCCALL*

Though the original location of the bar where Wild Bill Hickok met his end is farther down the street, the modern Saloon No. 10 (657 Main Street) has been embracing the legacy of Deadwood's most famous permanent resident for decades. There are so many historic photos and oddball artifacts hanging from the walls and ceiling that the establishment often markets itself as "the only museum in the world with a bar." In summer, the saloon re-enacts the events of Wild Bill's final

card game. During the last performance at 7:30 p.m., actors chase the murderer down the street and haul him off to a trial at the Masonic Temple (715 Main Street). The shows at the Saloon No. 10 are free, but admission to the Trial of Jack McCall is \$6 for adults and \$3 for children. You can also tour the original location of the #10 at the Wild Bill Bar (624 Main Street).

DEADWOOD ALIVE*

The actors who perform at the Trial of Jack McCall also stage shootouts and fun, audience-participation shows up and down Main Street during the summer months every day except Sunday. The shows are free and designed with families in mind.

1980 The last four remaining brothels are shut down by federal authorities.

1987 Fire destroys the historic Syndicate Block, fueling the discussion about legalized gaming to preserve Deadwood's historic buildings.

1989 Legalized gaming kicks off with slot machines, blackjack and poker. Deadwood is the first jurisdiction outside Nevada and



Atlantic City to offer gaming.

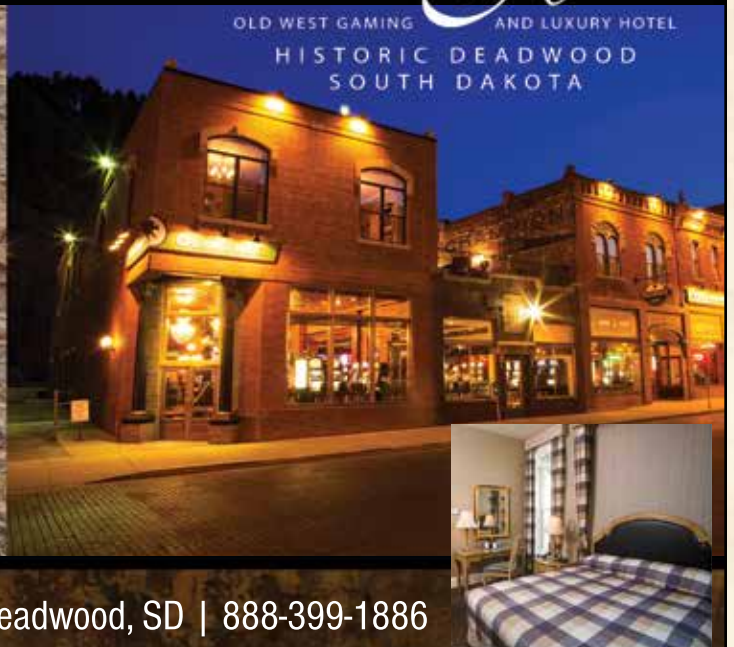
1998 The Mickelson Trail, running 109 miles along a former rail line from Deadwood to Edgemont, is completed.

2002 After 126 years, having mined to



depths of 8,000 feet, the Homestake Gold Mine shuts down. (It's now the Sanford Underground Lab.)

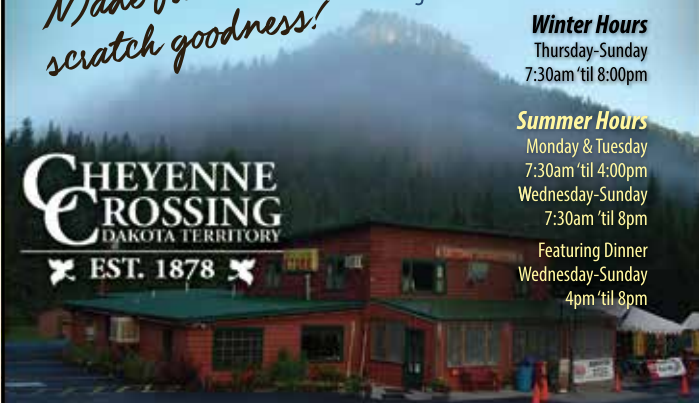

GET ACTIVE

IN DEADWOOD



If you've spent enough time in the office chair or the car for one day, there are plenty of ways to get up and get your blood moving in Deadwood. Whether you want to golf, hike or swim, there is plenty of action to be found in town!



MAIN STREET WALKING TOUR

Take a walking tour down Historic Main Street and learn about some of the secrets Deadwood's beautiful old buildings and landmarks have to offer. Pick up the Walking Tour Brochure at City Hall or a Visitor Center.

HIKE, BIKE OR SKI THE MICKELSON TRAIL

If you're ready for a longer walk, jog or bike ride, the northernmost trailhead of the 109-mile Mickelson Trail departs from the heart of Deadwood. Follow this former railroad line past historic mining buildings, over gurgling creeks and into

the Black Hills. During snowy months, the trail is excellent for cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and even snowmobiling in designated areas. Passes — \$4 for the day or \$15 for the season — are available at stations along the trail, a Deadwood Visitor Center or online.

THE NEW HOMESTAKE TRAIL

Created by the Northern Hills Recreation Association, this new trailer winds along the old Homestake Railroad grade, and is great for hiking and biking. The 3-mile Homestake Trail starts at the Dog Park in Lead and ends near the Deadwood Trailhead of the Mickelson Trail.



WINTER ACTIVITIES

With more than 150 inches of snowfall annually, the Black Hills brims with

a wide variety of trails with a range of difficulty near Cheyenne Crossing, at the junction of U.S. Hwy 85 and beautiful Spearfish Canyon.



winter adventures for all ages and skill levels. Enjoy downhill skiing and snowboarding at nearby Terry Peak Ski Area. Cross-country skiing and snowshoeing more your style? Then you'll discover

CLIMB THE TOWER ON MOUNT ROOSEVELT

Another hiking option is a short and beautiful hike up to the Friendship Tower, a monument built by Seth Bullock to honor his friend Theodore Roosevelt in 1919. The tower was restored in 2010, and visitors may now climb the spiral staircase to the top for stunning views across the Black Hills. The trailhead for this hike is located 1.5 miles north on U.S. Highway 85. Turn west on Forest Service Road 133 and continue about 2 miles to the parking area.

DEADWOOD REC CENTER

Deadwood's Rec Center offers a full range of exercise and family fun options, including an indoor pool, walking and running track, cardio room, weight room, basketball and racquetball courts, and regular classes. Day passes start at \$4 for an individual adult, \$7 for a family and \$2 for children 0-18 and adults over 55.

BE ENTERTAINED

YEAR-ROUND IN DEADWOOD



Deadwood comes alive with concerts on Main Street.



Deadwood's Wild West past has never gone completely to sleep, and throughout the year you'll find that Deadwood is as entertaining as it was in 1876, regardless of the season.



Entertainment is not necessarily a spectator sport in Deadwood. You can sit on the jury at the trial of Jack McCall, Wild Bill Hickok's murderer, and then head to one of the Deadwood's karaoke bars to show off your singing talents. You can also find wine tastings and special beer dinners going on throughout the year.

Be sure to check out Deadwood.com/events to see what's happening.

By the way, November to April are great times to get a good deal on lodging, even on weekends. Except for special events, Deadwood hotels, motels and inns offer steeply discounted rooms.

LIVE MUSIC

Bars and pubs such as Deadwood Tobacco Co, Saloon No. 10, Paddy O'Neill's, Wild Bill Bar, Nugget Saloon, Eagle Bar and Santana's in Deadwood offer live music throughout the year. Whether you want to hear new tunes from regional favorites or dance along to first-rate cover bands, there are plenty of options. During the ski season, you can often catch live music at the Dark Horse Saloon at Terry Peak Ski Area.



KARAOKE

Make your own music at venues such as Oyster Bay, Eagle Bar, the Bodega Bar and Deadwood Station Bunkhouse & Gambling Hall. You can hear some great singers, and some not-so-great singers at these venues. But it's fun.



THE TRIAL OF JACK MCCALL*

Witness a replay of one of the most famous crimes in Western history every evening, except Sundays, in downtown Deadwood. The evening begins at 7:30 p.m. when Jack McCall, Wild Bill's killer, is captured in front of the Saloon No. 10, shortly after doing the deed. Justice in Deadwood is indeed swift — at 8 p.m. Jack goes on trial just down the street at the Masonic Lodge. Tickets for the raucous, entertaining, family-friendly trial are \$6 for adults, \$5 for seniors, and \$3 for children.

CONCERTS

Musicians, comedians and live performers of every variety love to play in Deadwood. Big name acts can be found onstage all year long at the Deadwood Mountain Grand, on Main Street during Wild Bill Days in June and Kool Deadwood Nites in August, and in the heart of town during September's Deadwood Jam.



HISTORY NUGGET THE BADLANDS

Much of early Deadwood tried to put on a genteel Victorian front, but the area of saloons, brothels and gambling parlors along lower Main Street made no attempt at respectability.



The Badlands, also home to Deadwood's tiny Chinatown neighborhood, was well known for its wild and woolly ways. The notorious Gem Theater and the Green Front Saloon were Badlands landmarks. So was Nuttal & Mann's Saloon, later named the Saloon No. 10, where Wild Bill Hickok was murdered.

Archeologists in recent years have recovered more than 250,000 artifacts from this area, offering a fascinating picture of this infamous section of town. If you want to see the former Badlands for yourself, check out Main Street from Wall Street to the intersection of Highway 85 near the lower Main Street parking lot.

DISCOVER ART

IN DEADWOOD

Although Deadwood is best known for its historic architecture, you can find a number of sculptures and fine art here.



In fact, the six hand-painted, bas-relief welcome signs that greet visitors at the entrances to Deadwood are considered art in their own right. There were so many people pulling over to have their photo taken next to the welcome sign at Highways 14 and 85, the city had to build a pull-off area on the side

of the road. Each of the six signs has its own unique scene from Deadwood's history.

You can also find contemporary art in Deadwood. At the Jacobs Gallery on Main Street, fine artist Scott Jacobs' hyper-realistic painting style lavishes rich detail on his subjects, often motorcycles. Four other painters and photographers show their work at the gallery.

At Mind Blown Studio on Sherman Street, glass blower Toni Gerlach turns glass into an amazing variety of art pieces. She also offers glass-blowing classes.

Another noteworthy piece is the stone bust of Wild Bill Hickok, carved by Crazy Horse sculptor Korczak Ziolkowski. It stands at Sherman and Miller streets, next to Deadwood Dick's. Two other memorials to Wild Bill can be found, a gravesite bust at Mount Moriah and a seated Hickok in front of Tin Lizzie on Lower Main.

The discovery of gold along Whitewood



Creek in 1875 is memorialized in a sculpture at the entrance to the Days' of '76 Event Complex. It's a bronze sculpture of a prospector, gun on his hip, with a gold pan in one hand and a nugget in the other.

On Deadwood Street near the Franklin Hotel you will find a bronze sculpture of a rodeo cowboy atop a bucking horse created by western artist Tony Chytka. "Ride High, T.C., Ride High" is a tribute to T.C. Holloway, a rising PRCA star who was killed in a 2001 car accident.

sheriff. Bullock, a former lawman in Montana, took the job.

He later engaged in several businesses including a hotel that bears his name, a flour milling company, mining ventures and a ranch near present-day Belle Fourche. He met future president Teddy Roosevelt in 1884, and the men developed a lifelong friendship. Bullock and 50 South Dakota cowboys rode horses in Roosevelt's inaugural parade in 1905.

HISTORY NUGGET

SETH BULLOCK

Seth Bullock spent a lifetime trying to make Deadwood a permanent, prosperous place for future generations.

He and his business partner Sol Star arrived in Deadwood to open a hardware store in August 1876. Two days before they arrived, Wild Bill Hickok was gunned down. After the killing, the town decided it needed a



raucous mining camp into a prosperous and technologically rich city. Discover the triumphs and tragedies of two of Deadwood's founding families.



The Victorian home was built by pioneer businessman Harris Franklin, complete with stained glass windows, thoroughly modern 19th century plumbing and electricity, hand-painted canvas wall coverings, and telephone service. Visitors are treated to tea and cookies, only available through this tour.

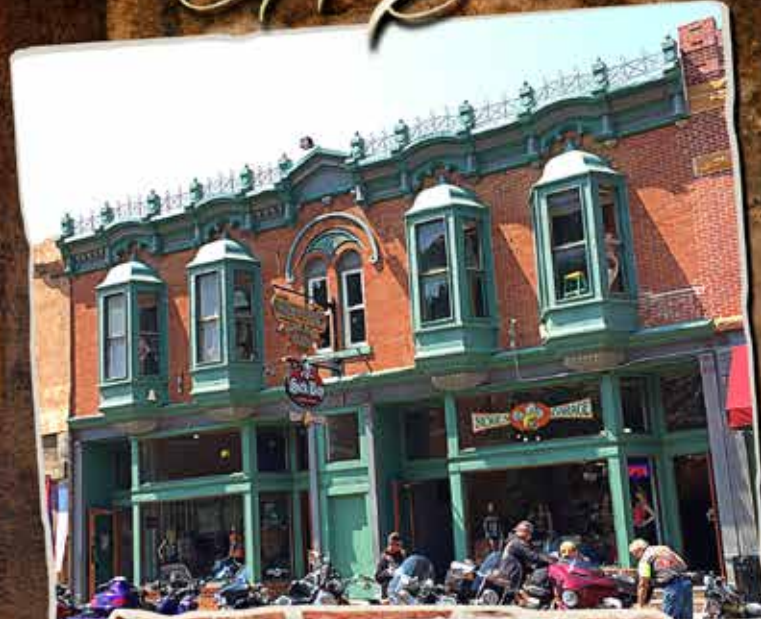

MAIN STREET SHOOTOUTS*

Hooligans, thieves and troublemakers occasionally escape from history and must be chased down and brought to justice. These live-action reenactments can be seen daily, except Sunday, during the summer. You might even find yourself deputized by the Marshal, who needs all the help he can get keeping the peace in Deadwood.

BROKEN BOOT GOLD MINE

Explore a historic gold mine cut right into the side of a hill, then pan for your very own gold nuggets. Open mid-May through mid-September, tour tickets cost \$4 for students, \$6 for adults and \$8 to pan for gold. You keep all the gold you find!

ADAMS MUSEUM CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS

RENT A BIKE

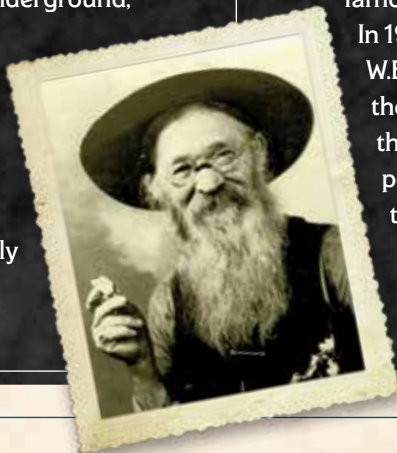

HISTORY NUGGET

POTATO CREEK JOHNNY

This diminutive prospector was a familiar sight on the streets of Deadwood until his death in 1943. John Perrett immigrated from Wales and eventually made his way to the Black Hills in the 1880s to seek his fortune.

Although most gold mining by then had gone underground, Johnny spent years using gold pans and sluice boxes to work his surface claims. In 1929, Johnny reportedly discovered one of the Black Hills'



largest gold nuggets weighing 7.346 troy ounces. (The nugget's authenticity though, has been questioned by some who suspect that Johnny melted several smaller nuggets to make the leg-shaped beauty.)

The nugget, and Johnny, became famous after the find. In 1934, businessman W.E. Adams bought the nugget. In 2014, the nugget went on permanent display at the Adams Museum. Johnny is buried in Mount Moriah Cemetery.

NORTHERN HILLS RAILWAY MODEL TRAIN DISPLAY

This massive model railroad display, located at 614 Main Street, has more than 50 locomotive engines and 400+ other train cars. A free attraction, the display is surprisingly detailed as it houses replicas of actual railroad lines that have crossed South Dakota and the Black Hills region.

INDULGE YOURSELF

IN DEADWOOD



Long known as the center of culture and indulgence, recent years have seen Deadwood's offerings refined to suit the most discriminating of experience-seekers. From locally crafted spirits to fine dining and full-day pampering, there are countless ways to treat yourself right in Deadwood.



WINE TASTING

Sample wine made from grapes grown in the Black Hills at the Belle Joli Winery Tasting Room (594 Main Street). There's outdoor seating on the patio, and the wines on offer include traditional reds and whites, as well as dessert and sparkling wines. At Deadwood Winery (696 Main), you can enjoy a variety of wines in a former bank. (Some of the wine is kept inside the vault.)

LOCAL BREWS, WINES & SPIRITS

Thirsty for a bigger taste of South Dakota? Try some locally made drinks at Deadwood's bars and saloons. Beer



drinkers should ask bartenders about brews made in the area. If wine is more your style, ask about bottles from the vineyards of Belle Joli and Prairie Berry. Both make wines in South Dakota.

CIGAR BAR

The sandstone turret of the Fairmont Hotel rises up from the corner of Main and Wall Streets. But if you're a cigar and tobacco aficionado, don't look up — look down. A set of stairs leads down from street level to the Deadwood Tobacco Co. & Cigar Bar, where you'll find cigars, loose-leaf tobacco and more than 50 different beers. This is one of the only bars in South Dakota with legal indoor smoking. A live blues band plays most weekends.

FINE DINING

Looking for a nice restaurant for a date night? You have plenty of upscale dining options. For a taste of regional ingredients, try the Deadwood Social Club (657 Main St.), just above the Saloon No. 10. The martini bar and outdoor fire pit add to the ambiance. Favorite dishes include the bison ravioli and smoked pheasant tuaca. For aged and hand-cut steaks, head for the Deadwood Legends Steakhouse, on the lower floor of the 1903 Franklin Hotel (700 Main St.) Aside from steaks, signature dishes include the vanilla fields salad, shrimp crepes and Colorado rack of lamb. The Gem Steakhouse and Saloon, in the Mineral Palace Hotel (601 Main Street), offers hand-cut steaks (aged at least 21 days) and fine wine in a fun atmosphere. The menu is based on the real-life characters from the Deadwood HBO series. The Grand Grille, in Deadwood Mountain Grand (1906 Deadwood Mountain Drive) provides an upscale dining experience, whether it's a light lunch or elegant



dinner. In summer, the restaurant has an outdoor dining patio overlooking Whitewood Creek. A short drive from downtown on U.S. 85, the Deadwood Grille at The Lodge at Deadwood (100 Pine Crest Lane), has a spacious mission-style dining room, decorated with stone and wood paneling. The menu includes walleye, whiskey sirloin and champagne chicken.



tipi. The Grand Spa & Salon at the Deadwood Mountain Grand (1906 Deadwood Mountain Drive) provides salon hair services in addition to their regular spa treatments.



CHUBBY CHIPMUNK

Chocolate connoisseurs would do well to visit Chubby Chipmunk (420 Cliff Street), a local confectionary on the south edge of Deadwood. Though the tiny store also has ice cream and candies on offer, the handmade chocolate truffles are the main attraction. Don't let the humble storefront fool you; Chubby Chipmunk has been asked to supply chocolates for guests at the Country Music Awards, Oscars and the GRAMMY Awards, and the store has been featured in Every Day with Rachael Ray magazine.

DAY SPAS

Need a vacation from your vacation? There are two day spas in Deadwood to help you relax. Akela Spa (11842 U.S. 14) is perched on a hilltop just a mile east of town. Akela Spa provides traditional spa services, including massages, pedicures and facials, but it is probably best-known for the dry sauna, housed in a Lakota-style

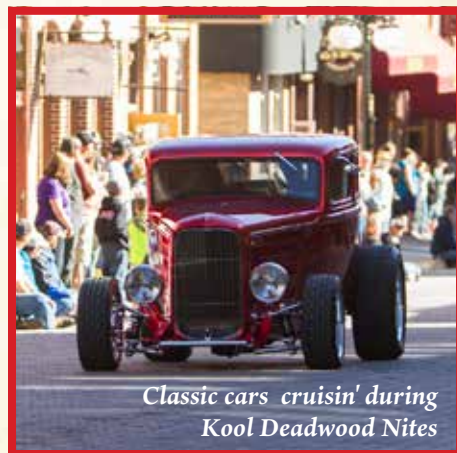

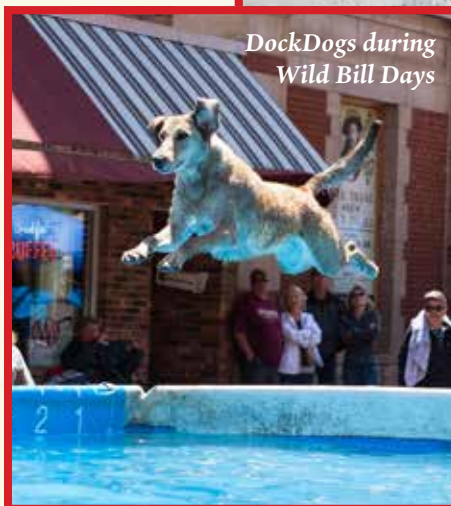

HISTORY NUGGETS

AL SWEARENGEN

Some fans of the HBO series Deadwood are surprised to discover that there really was an Al Swearengen in Deadwood's earliest days. And he was every bit as nasty – if not nastier – than the HBO character played by Ian McShane.

In the spring of 1877, Swearengen opened the Gem Theater, his notorious brothel and dance hall. He lured young women



with the promise of jobs, then forced them to work in the brothel.

He swindled his customers, and was uncannily adept at politics.

He left Deadwood in 1899. Five years later, his body was found on a Denver street.

Initially, it was thought he died accidentally while trying to hop a freight train. More recent historical research hints that he was likely beaten to death.

Off-road enthusiasts can take off on the Forest's Motorized system consisting of 600 miles of designated trail bisecting with 3,600 miles of unpaved roads. Adventurers can rent ATVs and UTVs at area outfitters or bring their own vehicles. The trail system requires a modest weekly or annual fee for use and you must have a valid drivers license for travel on roadways.



DOWNHILL, CROSS COUNTRY SKIING & SNOWSHOEING

Winter is an excellent time to visit Deadwood. Downhill slopes are located within 15 minutes drive from the historic town. If you didn't bring your gear, don't worry. Rental equipment is available on-site and at area outfitters.

Prefer a slow and steady pace? Cross country skiing on pristine snow or groomed tracks is plentiful around Deadwood. Rentals are available at area outfitters. Snowshoeing is another great way to explore backcountry and hiking trails in the Winter. Many state parks in South Dakota as well as Game, Fish & Parks offices have free snowshoe rentals.

HIKE, BIKE OR RIDE THE MICKELSON TRAIL

If you're ready for a challenge, the northernmost trailhead of the 109-mile Mickelson Trail departs from Deadwood. This former rail line takes you past historic mining buildings, over creeks and into the Black Hills. Passes are available at stations along the trail, at a Deadwood Visitor Center or online. Bike rentals and shuttles are available May through mid-October. Horseback riding is also available.





SNOWMOBILING

Snowmobiling is a great way to traverse the Black Hills National Forest in the winter, especially in the 5,500+ foot elevations surrounding Deadwood. The backcountry commonly builds a 5-foot snowpack for off-trail riding and the National Forest is home to a 350-mile network of marked, mapped and groomed trails. One of those trails leads directly into town! Snowmobile rentals are available at several trail-side outfitters near Deadwood.

METAL DETECTING AND GOLD PANNING

Gold panning and metal detecting within the City limits of Deadwood is allowed on public property and private property with written permission from the City of Deadwood or the landowner. But please remember, Deadwood is a National Historic Landmark and any artifact of significance (anything over 50 years old) found while metal detecting must be left in place. When calling the City of Deadwood about panning or metal detecting, ask to speak with the Planning and Preservation Office. They will provide a map of approved areas and instructions about the amount of disturbance allowed.

Once you exit Deadwood city limits, you are either on private land, or in the Black Hills National Forest. Searching for a bit of treasure is allowed in the National Forest, if the land is unclaimed and if you follow the rules. Your first challenge is to make sure you are not on private land for either activity. A map with those details can be

purchased from any Forest Service location.

Next, you need to find land that is unclaimed. That's harder than you might think. Remember, mining in this area of the Black Hills has been ongoing since the mid-1870s. Mineral claims on public land (managed by the BLM) are roughly 20 acres - approximately 600 feet wide by 1,500 feet long. Placer mining claims are also 20 acres, but are often irregularly shaped and follow a creek or other natural water source. Only hand tools (pan, shovel, sluice, etc) are allowed without a permit, so it's most likely you'll be searching for a placer mining location. In that case, be sure to walk the creek bed for up to 1,000 feet checking for prominent claim markers. There is often one at the beginning, middle and end of a claim. When in doubt, call the Northern Hills District National Forest Service station and ask to speak to the Minerals Administrator (605-642-4622). They can direct you to an appropriate, unclaimed area.

Metal detecting for coins or a nugget is allowed on unclaimed Forest Service land. Artifacts of significance are considered anything over 50 years old and should be left in place. If you have questions about artifacts found in the National Forest, call the nearest Forest Service office and ask to speak to a District Archeologist.



HISTORY NUGGETS

MOUNT MORIAH

When Wild Bill Hickok was gunned down in August 1876, he was buried in the Ingleside Cemetery not far from Main Street. This was not, however, the famous gunman's final resting place.



As the town grew and the cemetery filled, city fathers realized that the graveyard property could better be used by the living. Beginning in 1878, they dug up the bodies – at least all the ones they could find – and reburied them on a tree-covered hilltop they named Mount Moriah. It's where you'll find the graves of Wild Bill, Calamity Jane, Potato Creek Johnny, Seth Bullock, Sol Star and hundreds of Deadwood's early residents.

City fathers did indeed overlook some of the Ingleside graves. Every few years -- as recently as 2012 -- construction crews have unearthed the remains of dearly departed denizens of Deadwood. They were subsequently given a proper burial, so after 140 years, they can finally rest in peace.

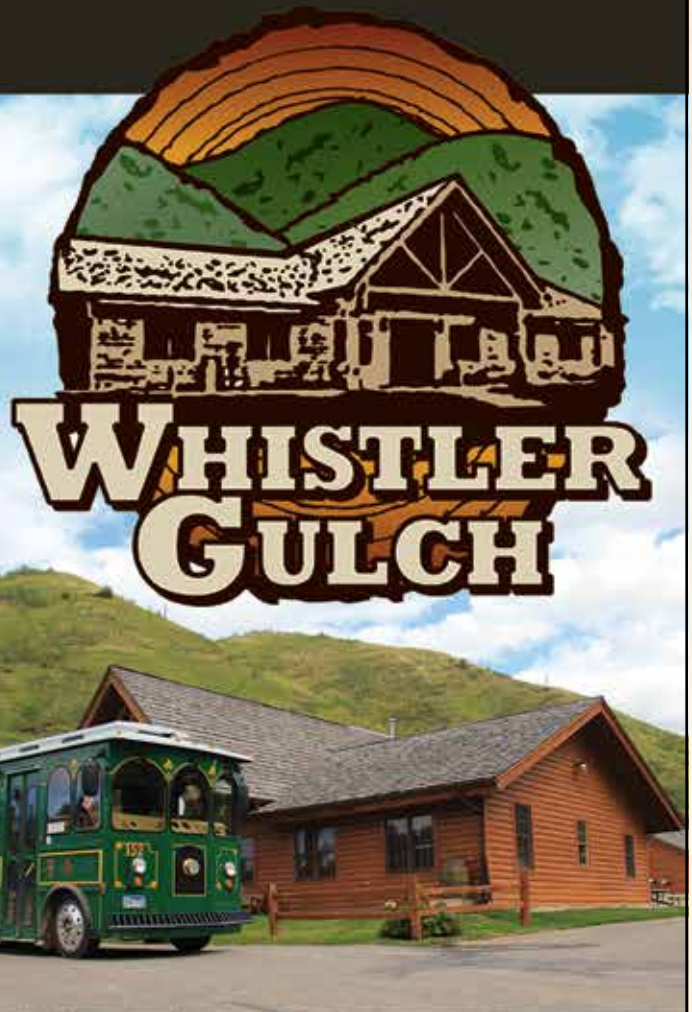

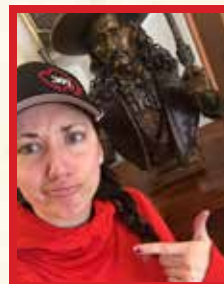
